To get your child moving in the right direction and to help them develop a habit of reading on a daily basis, your child should read during the summer. It will be helpful for students to keep a list of the books that they read, because in order for the summer book(s) to count toward their RW goal, they will need to complete an assignment about the book, once the school year begins. The requirements of this assignment will be shared with the students in September.

RW books should be books that your child has not read while in elementary school. Students may choose any genre that interests them: fiction, non-fiction, mystery, etc. . . The public library is a wonderful resource to help you find books and authors at your child's independent reading level.
